

In support of a collaborative regional effort to create a strategy of upward economic mobility for all, we are focused on critical programs and services for low-income residents and make our deepest investments in Early Childhood Development and Education, Workforce and Career Development, and Affordable Housing. Funding is also directed to other social supports like access to primary and mental health care, healthy food, visual and cultural arts and our local natural resources.










